Goodwin Named Dean Of Students

Edward R. Goodwin, assistant professor of technology at Ferrum Junior College, has been named dean of students by C. Ralph Arthur, president of the Franklin County school.

In his new position, Goodwin is responsible to Dr. Edwin C. Price, dean of the college, for student living arrangements, activities, traffic control, and general conduct. His staff includes an associate dean of students, Miss Faye Wood, and seven dormitory counselors.

Goodwin came to Ferrum in September, 1967, as a teacher in the new engineering technology program after eight years industrial experience with the Sperry-Rand Corporation, Gainesville, Fla. A graduate of Waynesboro High School, he holds a B. S. degree in education from the University of Virginia and M. Ed. from the University of Florida.

During his first year at Ferrum, he organized and taught a special electronics course to enable students to pass the Federal Communications Commission First Class Broadcast License examination and prepare them for careers as TV and radio maintenance engineers for the broadcasting industry.

Goodwin, himself, has held the license for 27 years. He has been chief engineer for radio stations WAYB, Waynesboro; WKEY, Covington, and KNOE, Monroe, La.

As a Chief Warrant Officer in World War II, Goodwin served with the 6th Army in the Pacific Theatre during three campaigns.

He is married to the former Virginia Ferguson of Waynesboro. A daughter Sally, a senior at the University of Florida School of Physical Therapy, completes the family.
